# 3 – Extension Activity for *Spending Sense*



## Specific Outcome(s)

At the end of this extension activity, student will be able to identify and define goods and services.

## Logistics

- Print the Goods & Services handout 😊
  - o Print enough copies for each student.

#### Procedure

- Review the difference between goods and services with students:
  - o "Goods are physical objects. They are things that can be touched."
  - o "Services are jobs someone does for someone else."
- Ask students for examples of goods and services.
- Distribute the Goods & Services handout to students.
- Review answers with students after they have completed the handout and thank them for their hard work.



# Goods and Services

A good is a physical object. Goods are things that you can touch. If you go to the store and buy an orange, you are paying for a good.

A service is a job someone does for someone else. When you buy a service, you hire people to perform work. You are not buying something you can touch. If your bike is broken, you might hire someone to fix it. You are paying for a service.
