# 4 – Extension Activity for *Comparing Costs*



## Specific Outcome(s)

- Physical Education and Wellness
  - o Money is commonly exchanged in the form of
    - currency
  - o Currency includes coins and paper money.

At the end of this extension activity, students will be able to identify Canada's coins and bank notes by name, colour, and denomination.

#### Materials Needed

Scissors

Cardstock

#### Materials Provided

Coin puzzles


• Bank note puzzles


### Logistics

- Photocopy and cut the coin puzzles and the bank note puzzles. You may also have students practice their cutting
  - o Print enough copies for each student.


#### Procedure

- Remind students that our currency is the Canadian dollar, and we use coins and bills for our money in Canada.
  - o Money is currency, and it looks different in different places in the world.
  - o Coins are made of metal, and they're round.
  - o Bills are made of a plastic-like material, and they're rectangular.
- Additionally, share that a decimal is used to write numbers that aren't whole numbers (e.g., a loonie represents a whole number, while a quarter represents only part of a whole number). You may want to use "more than" and "less than" comparisons to help students with their understanding of place value.
- Explain that the puzzles students are about to do can fit together in many ways, but the goal is to put them together so that everything matches.
  - o Provide a brief demonstration of how to build one of the puzzles.
- Hand out the cut-out puzzles (two puzzles, five puzzles, seven puzzles, or all ten puzzles) to students and give them time to build them.
- Have students return their materials to you and thank them for their hard work. Ask them the following review questions to solidify their learning:
  - o "What colours are our coins? What colours are our bills?"
  - o "What are our coins called? In other words, what are their names?"
  - o "What pictures are on our money?"
