

Pickle's Nickel Extension Activity for Earn, Save, Spend & Share or I Need It! I Want It! Presentations

Grade Level:

Grade 1 – Grade 2

Learning Objective:

This extension activity, along with the *Earn, Save, Spend & Share* or *I Need It! I Want It!* presentations, should help students:

• Become familiar with the names and values of Canadian coins

Materials Needed:

- *Pickle's Nickel* poem (1 per student)
- Pickle's Nickel worksheet (1 per student)
- Pencils (1 per student)

Lesson Plan:

- 1. Read the poem *Pickle's Nickel* aloud to students
- 2. Distribute pencils, *Pickle's Nickel* poem and *Pickle's Nickel* worksheet to students
- 3. Review answers with students

Pickle's Nickel: Answer Key

- 1. How many cents would Pickle need to buy a lime? *10 cents*
- 2. How many nickels would Pickle need to buy a lime? 2 nickels
- 3. How many cents would Pickle need to buy a lemon? 25 cents
- 4. What Canadian coin would Pickle need to buy a bottle of pop? *Loonie*
- 5. What Canadian coin would Pickle need to buy his dog a collar? *Toonie*
- 6. How many cents would Pickle need to buy two limes? 20 cents
